Hollywood reporter most trusted news

6:45 PST 11/13/2018 by Jeremy Barr While cable news has become medium du jour during Donald Trump's presidency, with Fox News hosts cheering for a president who has campaigned against CNN and MSNBC, even the most successful shows on these networks may not draw as many viewers as the lowest-rated of tonight's broadcast news. Cable also tracks broadcasting in another important calculation: audience confidence. According to a new Hollywood Reporter/Morning Consult survey of about 2,200 adults, NBC Nightly News host Lester Holt is the most trusted TV news personality in America, trusted much of 32 percent of respondents and some by 30 percent. He's followed by two ABC News anchors: his late-night contestant David Muir (28 percent trust a lot) and Good Morning America co-host Robin Roberts (28 percent). Only one cable news host, CNN's Anderson Cooper (29 percent), is considered highly credible by more than a quarter of Americans surveyed. On the contrary, the 10 least reliable TV news personalities all work for cable networks: Fox News host Sean Hannity leads the way (30 percent say they don't trust him at all) followed by MSNBC's Rachel Maddow (26 percent), CNN's Don Lemon (25 percent) and MSNBC's Mika Brzezinski (23 percent). Holt, Muir and CBS Evening News anchor Jeff Glor, who rarely editorially or expresses political feelings, are also seen as the three least ideological news noities. Trust is at the heart of what we do, Holt told THR. The recent sustained attacks on the truth remind us of how valuable it is. For me, there is no higher honor than having earned that trust. Overall, 31 percent of Americans rely on major television news networks a lot, compared to 27 percent for cable news. Cable news watchers also worry more than network news watchers (35 percent vs. 31 percent) about the accuracy of broadcasts. I'm not surprised that broadcast news reporters have more credibility than cable because cable has increasingly gone to the meaningful model in recent years, said Feldstein, a professor of broadcast journalism at the University of Maryland who has worked for both ABC News and CNN. MSNBC anchor Brian Williams (24 percent) is the fifth most trusted news personality, less than four years after losing his Nightly News perch to Holt amid an embellishment scandal. (I let down my NBC colleagues and our viewers, and I am determined to earn back his trust, he said in June 2015.) One earns trust by having a long record of being fair and getting the facts right, says Greta Van Susteren, who anchored all three major cable news networks. Trust is different from likability, which TV networks monitor through what is called a Q Score. According to the survey, 69 percent of respondents say likability is a very or somewhat important factor when deciding where to watch policy news, while only 23 percent say it's not important. I think is what matters to news, news. Says. I don't think likability means much at all. Harris Faulkner, who worked in local TV news before joining Fox News, is the network's most trusted personality (24 percent), but its pollsters are most liked - Tucker Carlson leads the way (+31 net favoritism among Republicans), followed by fellow primetime host Laura Ingraham (+26) and morning host Ainsley Earhardt (+25), who is also the most trusted of Fox & Friends co-anchors. Hannity and Carlson are seen by respondents as the most partisan TV personalities, with 8 and 9 percent saying the two have no skinny. Overall, Holt (+35), Roberts (+32) and Muir (+27) have the biggest net favors among TV personalities, while Hannity (-7), MSNBC's Joe Scarborough (-5) and Maddow (+1) among the smallest have. We all like to be liked, and it's important that people feel comfortable with the person presenting the news, Holt said. If I could have likability and trust too, I would be very happy. But I didn't get into this business to be liked. I came into it to tell stories, open my eyes and hold those in power accountable. NEW YORK (CNN Business)The Hollywood Reporter unveiled its 2019 list of the most powerful figures in the New York media on Thursday, and this year it is made up of some of the most influential people in the news industry. We're hyper-focused on the influencers in the news media, THR editorial director Matthew Belloni told CNN Business in a phone interview this week. No sport. No entertainment. This is the news feed list. The annual list usually reflects trends and changes in the fast-moving media industry. With President Trump at the White House, Belloni and his staff believe politics has been a major driver of the news cycle. This year's list includes a good number of journalists and news figures who have amassed power and influence of their own by aggressively covering one of the most powerful offices in the country. So who's on the list? Many names you might recognize from TV news, major newspapers and digital media ventures. From the morning network news programs, ABC News chief anchor George Stephanopoulos, Good Morning America anchor Robin Roberts, GMA co-host Michael Strahan, CBS This Morning co-hosts Gayle King, Norah O'Donnell and John Dickerson, as well as Today show co-anchors Savannah Guthrie, Hoda Kotb, and Craig Melvin made the list. From the evening news casts, there are David Muir, Jeff Glor and Lester Holt, anchors for ABC World News Tonight, CBS Evening News and NBC Nightly News, respectively. Television news executives on the list include president of ABC News James Goldston, chairman of NBCUniversal broadcasting, sports and news Lazarus, chairman of NBC News and MSNBC Andy Lack, president of NBC News Noah Oppenheim, President of MSNBC Phil Griffin, CEO of Fox News Suzanne Scott, President and CEO of Fox News Jay Wallace, Chairman of WarnerMedia News and Sports President of CNN Worldwide Jeff Zucker, and President and Senior Executive Producer of CBS News Susan Zirinsky. They are joined by the hosts of The View - Joy Behar, Whoopi Goldberg, Sunny Hostin, Abby Huntsman, and Meghan McCain.Late-night hosts and comedians also take up more than a few spots on the list. Stephen Colbert, Seth Meyers, Jimmy Fallon, John Oliver, Trevor Noah, Hasan Minhaj and Samantha Bee all scored spots on it. The annual power rating wouldn't be complete without cable news personalities. MSNBC hosts Chris Hayes, Rachael Maddow, Lawrence O'Donnell, Joe Scarborough, and Mika Brzezinski earned spots on the list. So did CNN hosts Anderson Cooper, Chris Cuomo, Don Lemon and Brian Stelter.And, of course, members of the Fox News series. Sean Hannity, Shepard Smith, Steve Doocy, Ainsley Earhardt and Brian Kilmeade all got a place. There are some notable first on the list this year as well. The New York Times journalists behind the podcast The Daily make their first appearance. Presenter Michael Barbaro and producer Lisa Tobin are on the list. Assistant editor of audio, film, TV and digital projects Sam Dolnick, who helped launch the popular podcast, also made the cut. Belloni noted that The Daily has broken through as the first truly impactful news podcast. This is a general news podcast that has 8 million listeners, and that's pretty important, he said. Michael Barbaro is a big star. And the fact that it comes from The New York Times is interesting. They have managed to leverage their expertise and brand in a new platform in a way other media are trying to replicate. Also from the Times is Maggie Haberman on the list, as are the paper's editor-in-chief, Dean Baquet, and publisher A.G. Sulzberger. The Wall Street Journal's editor-in-chief Matt Murray also secured a spot. The heads of the major digital media companies were also awarded seats. Vice President Nancy Dubuc, HuffPost editor-in-chief Lydia Polgreen, Daily Beast editor-in-chief Noah Shachtman and BuzzFeed editor-in-chief Ben Smith are on the list. NBC Nightly News host Lester Holt is the most trusted news anchor in the United States, according to a new poll. The Hollywood Reporter/Morning Consult survey of 2,200 adults showed that 32 percent said they trusted Holt a lot compared to 30 percent who trusted him some. CNN's Anderson Cooper came in second, with 29 percent saying they trusted him a lot compared to 27 percent who said they trusted him some. They were followed by ABC evening news host David Muir - 28 percent said they trusted him a lot - and Good Morning America co-host Robin Roberts, who was also at 28 percent. The 10 least trusted hosts were Fox News host Sean Hannity - 30 percent said they don't trust him at all, followed by MSNBC's Rachel Maddow (26 percent), CNN's Don Lemon (25 percent), and MSNBC's Mika Brzezinski (23 percent).
